

# Judge Bob Bellear Legal Careers Pathways Cadetship Program

#### What is the Cadetship Program?

The Judge Bob Bellear Legal Careers Pathways - Cadetship program (the program) provides opportunities for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Law students to undertake paid employment while undertaking their Law degree.

During their cadetship, students will be offered the opportunity to work alongside Legal Aid NSW solicitors across the three core areas of legal practice, Family, Civil or Criminal Law.

Legal Aid NSW is one of a select few organisations that provide cadets with a first-hand insight into the operation of a wide range of courts and tribunals across NSW. Cadets gain practical experience in a flexible work environment where they can acquire exposure to various matters of legal procedure.

Following the successful completion of a cadetship, cadets are encouraged to apply for further employment within Legal Aid NSW through the Aboriginal Professional Legal Placement Training Program (PLT) and/or the Graduate Career Development Program.

#### Who is eligible to apply for the Cadetship Program?

The Cadetship Program is open to **Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander** people who are currently undertaking or near the completion of a law degree. The advertisement for the role sets out the criteria that applicants must address to be considered for the program.

To be eligible to become a Legal Aid NSW cadet an applicant must:

- Be of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent and identify as such in the community;
- Provide evidence of enrolment in an LLB or equivalent course in an approved Australian tertiary institution for an undergraduate degree; a combined undergraduate degree; a post graduate degree; or an Honours/Masters year as part of an undergraduate degree.

**Note**: Prospective applicants in Year 12 intending to enrol in university may apply for a cadetship. However, commencing as a cadet would be subject to proof of actual enrolment.

We are looking for applicants who:

- have a sound academic track record and can work in a diverse and challenging work environment;
- are good communicators and highly motivated;
- are committed and sensitive to the needs of our disadvantaged client groups in a social justice environment;
- are interested in our legal practice areas;
- can demonstrate initiative, adaptability and problem-solving skills;
- are committed to offering excellent customer service and working in a high-volume work environment as a valued team member; and
- have the ability to drive their own self-development.

### **Cadet Recruitment**

Recruitment for the 2020 intake of cadets is now open, with applications closing on **9 February 2020**.

Interviews will be conducted in **February 2020**, with cadets commencing in approximately **March 2020**. This recruitment will be used to fill current vacancies and create a Talent Pool, which will be used to fill future vacancies.

# Salary and allowances

- Appointment at the Clerk Grade General scale;
- A salary package of up to \$27,700 which includes:
  - o a fortnightly salary based on a 60-day placement;
  - a study allowance of \$600 per fortnight; and
  - o a book allowance of \$500 per semester.

# Work placements

**Work placements** are a critical part of the cadetship providing on the job development opportunities and meaningful work experience relevant to the qualification.

Cadets are entitled to undertake a work placement of 60 days (12 weeks) per calendar year.

Cadets will undertake a rotation of one practice area per year. Placements are generally undertaken during the long break (December to February) when cadets work 12 weeks full-time, however different work schedules can be negotiated with the employer, should the cadet opt to work during the semester.

The work placement will involve the provision of a good standard of administrative legal support to legal officers in the Criminal, Family or Civil Law practice areas.

Depending on the cadet's length of term in the undergraduate law degree and level of experience this may include:

- Assistance with the preparation and co-ordination of court documentation relating to briefs and to support the practice/region;
- Communicating and/or liaising with clients and other stakeholders including the private profession.

The length of a cadetship may range from 1 to 4 years, due to different course lengths and the stage of study when a cadet commences. A cadetship can commence at any time during the year and at any stage of study.

### **Locations and placements**

During the application process, cadets will have the opportunity to provide location and practice area preferences.

These will be taken into consideration during the placement process and cadets may have the opportunity to be placed in a practice area of their preference and can potentially be placed state-wide. Applicants should note however, that whilst practice area and location preferences will be considered, operational requirements are a priority consideration and work schedules may change based on this.

# Legal Aid NSW practice areas

#### **Criminal Law**

The Criminal Law practice assists people charged with criminal offences appearing before the Local Court, Children's Court, District Court, Supreme Court, Court of Criminal Appeal and the High Court.

We provide <u>legal advice and minor assistance</u>, <u>duty appearances</u> and <u>case representation</u> at courts throughout the State. The Criminal Division also provides advice and representation in specialist jurisdictions including the Parole Authority, Drug Court and the Youth Drug and Alcohol Court. Our specialist services include:

- Children's Legal Service including the Youth Hotline
- Drug Court
- Prisoners Legal Service

#### **Family Law**

The Family Law practice helps adults and children resolve their family disputes and to achieve safe and workable care arrangements for children.

We provide <u>legal advice and minor assistance</u>, <u>duty services</u>, <u>family dispute resolution</u> and <u>case representation</u> in commonwealth family law matters, including child support matters, and in state care and protection matters across NSW. Specialist services provided by the family law practice include:

- Child support (for carer and paying parents)
- Care and protection

- Early Intervention Unit
- Independent Children's Lawyer

### **Civil Law**

The Civil Law practice helps resolve legal issues that impact on people's everyday lives such as debts, unpaid fines, discrimination, tenancy issues, Centrelink disputes and more. Our focus is on helping people to resolve legal issues as early as possible.

We provide free <u>legal advice</u> in a wide range of areas, help at some <u>courts and tribunals</u>, and <u>grants of legal aid</u> for matters which are eligible under our <u>policies</u>.

Community workers play a critical role in connecting people to legal assistance services. The <u>Law for Everyday Life DVD</u> explains how you can spot a civil law problem and where help is available. We also provide <u>training</u> in civil law for front-line staff, and <u>education sessions for the public</u>.
