HOW IT WORKS

Depending on both your current situation and the business needs of TAFE NSW, there are two available options.

Option 1 - Start teaching now

Complete the Enterprise Trainer–Presenting Skill Set (TAES00014) course. This course takes four to six weeks of part time study, and successful completion of the course enables you to teach under the supervision of an experienced teacher, helping to build your confidence.

While teaching under supervision, you would then work to complete the full Certificate IV in Training and Assessment (TAE40116) course, and on your successful completion, you would be able to teach unsupervised.

Option 2 - Plan to teach in the future

By undertaking this option, you can study the Certificate IV in Training and Assessment (TAE40116) while remaining in your current employment role. Then, upon successful completion, you can move into a teaching role.

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
